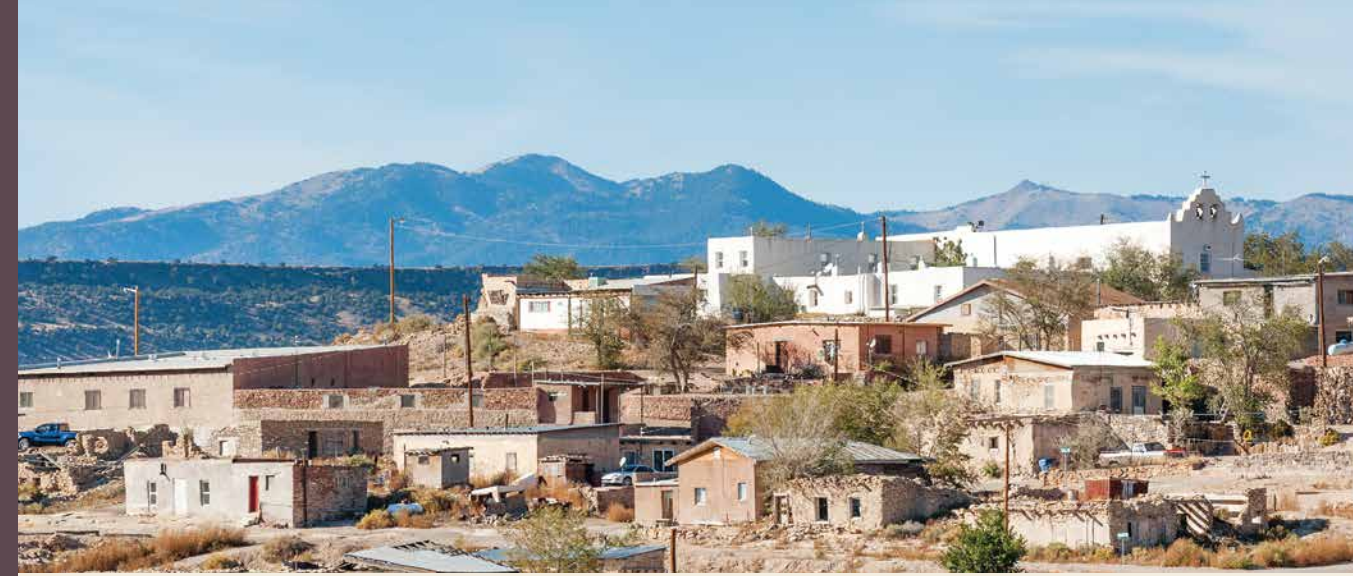

COMMUNITY INVESTMENT



The San Juan County Clean Energy Foundation was created to make positive impacts on the communities in San Juan County and the surrounding areas. The SJCECF receives 100% of its funding from Energy Fuels' White Mesa Mill in Blanding.

Energy Fuels is a leading U.S. producer of critical minerals used in clean energy and advanced technology products and one of the largest private employers in San Juan County. The foundation was seeded with \$1 million from Energy Fuels in 2021, and the company has donated 1% of the mill's revenues to the foundation each year since.



A CULTURE OF GIVING



Energy Fuels plays a critical role in mining and processing the minerals that support U.S. innovation, clean energy and national security. As a leader in U.S. uranium production and the processing of rare earth elements and other critical minerals, the company is helping build a strong domestic supply chain while advancing a cleaner and healthier future.

As San Juan County becomes a critical minerals hub for the U.S., Energy Fuels believes meaningful community investment is the best way to make a real, lasting difference for the people who work alongside us.

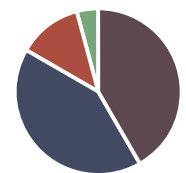

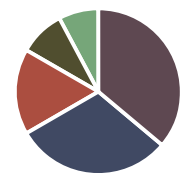

AIS PREP

AIS PREP is a free educational preparatory program for Native American youth focusing on rigorous STEM instruction designed to prepare students for higher education. The foundation granted funds to support student lodging for five years, backpacks for each student, snacks and end-of-term celebrations for the students.



SAN JUAN COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE

The San Juan County Sheriff's Office received a grant to launch a K9 drug detection program that enhances public safety and helps reduce drug trafficking and substance abuse in the region. Funding helped them acquire the K9, equipment and specialized narcotics detection training.



UTAH FOOD BANK

Utah Food Bank opened new food pantries in Blanding, Montezuma Creek and Monument Valley. With the grant from the foundation, they purchased Bluebird Flour for Utah Food Bank's Southeastern Distribution Center, addressing food insecurity affecting 2,490 residents, including 20% of children in the county.



CITY OF MONTICELLO VETERANS PARK

The City of Monticello received a \$70,000 grant to support the installation of an ADA-accessible playground. The project will provide a safe and welcoming environment for children of all abilities and their families, fostering community engagement and benefiting local businesses.



UNITED WAY OF EASTERN UTAH - SOLES2SOULS

The United Way of Eastern Utah's Soles2Souls program provides shoes to students in San Juan County, helping them focus on their education without the distraction of ill-fitting footwear. With \$12,500 in grants from the foundation, 907 pairs of shoes were distributed to local kids.
